1. Introduction from current Chairman : Paul Sayers	Paul Sayers opened the meeting with a welcome and explained who the current committee are and the roles that we cover. He explained how the meeting will run and how the current committee would stand down and then those who wanted to remain on the committee would put themselves up for reelection	

2. 2024/2025 A Review

Paul ran through the club highlights from the year. These were available for members as a copy to take away.

Some of the headlines were:

Thanks to Ewelina for the **Couch 2 5K** course she ran earlier in the year. Thanks also to Emma Sugden and other members who supported with this. Some members of this course are now running with us a club run night, some have already progressed into group 2 and some have booked onto the Morley 10k. They completed a parkrun graduation at Rothwell which was supported by club members.

Thank you to Stephen Cheeseman for hosting a monthly **quiz** after running club. These have been well attended and a great social event for members. This will continue once a month over the Winter months at the Rugby Club whilst the Cricket Club is closed.

Thank you for the support for the **Yorkshire Veterans race**. The club members made it a great success.

	We have an average of 83 runners every Wednesday at Club night and an average of 10 run leaders. The Christmas do last year was a great success and this year it is booked for Friday 12 th December. We had a London Marathon Place allocated because of the number of affiliated members we have . Katie Edwards-Fox was successful in the draw for the place and proudly ran in Morley club colours on the day. We should have confirmation of a marathon place allocation for 2026 in the next couple of months.	
3. Parkrun league	James Adams talked about the parkrun league for 2025. He gave an overview of how it was working and the next events planned. He spoke about the current league positions and where members can get updates about this. There are 3 events left and the next on is a Nostell on October 11 th .	

4. Race of the month	James Adams talked through the race of the month. He said that attendance was low at lots of these events. He explained that the races had been chosen with varying distances and terrain but welcomed feedback as to why members aren't running in these particular races.	
	Question: A member asked if the races could be advertised more as many members weren't aware of them and didn't always check the website.	Action JA: to do a social media post in advance of the event to publicise it. Include a mention of car sharing.
	Question : A member asked if people would post on FB if they are able to car share to get to the events. Everyone agreed this was a good idea.	
5. Kit supply	Susan Redfearn talked through the kit process and how well it seemed to be working. She explained the sizing was much truer to size than previous manufacturers and she welcomed feedback from members.	
	Question: A member asked if we could introduce a jersey zipped hoody. Susan explained this was a from a different company to the running kit but that she was happy to email the company to see if this was an option.	Action SR : To email PB teamwear with this request.

	Question: Could a hi vis option be available for t-shirts	Action SR : To email Apex clothing with this request.
6. Vet's league	Paul Sayers spoke about the vets' league. He said the feedback had been really positive from the runners and the residents of the St Andrew's estate where the race starts and finishes. This event brings a lot of money into the club and puts Morley on the map. This year our event so far has had the 2 nd highest attendance of all events. 338 runners attended. We have agreed to host again on 16 th June next year and volunteers and runners are welcomed.	
7. Affiliated members	Rachael Kearns spoke about the affiliation process. The affiliation year runs from 1 st April until 31 st March. We have 82 affiliated members and 2 who have stated MRC as a 2 nd claim club. This is much higher than we have had previously which is great. Rachael explained that there are many benefits to being affiliated. One of which is discounts in races.	

	This number of affiliated members ensures that we have numbers high enough to qualify for a London Marathon place for our club. Rachael asked anyone interested to reach out to the membership secretary. Question: One member asked if you get confirmation that you are affiliated as she didn't believe she received anything. Rachael explained you should receive an email.	Action: PS/RK to cross check affiliated members list to confirm .
8. Run Leader update	Emma Sugden thanked the run leaders overall and said how valuable they are to the smooth running of the club. Ellie Parker Hyde was thanked as a new run leader and Jack O and Kelvin were thanked as they are finishing their courses and are nearly ready to start leading. There are 17 run leaders currently but with holidays and commitments it is often difficult to sort 2 run leaders per group out.	

	Emma appealed for run leaders. She would be so grateful if anyone would consider doing the course. There is no need to be able to run lead all 6 groups. Happy to accept group run leaders who would be happy running in group 1 or 2 every week. Emma explained that although the member would initially pay for the course, 50% would be refunded after completing 10 runs as run leader.	
9. Voting : New committee for 2025/2026	Rachael Kearns and Emma Ribbons stood down and decided not to be reelected. This opened up the roles of Membership Co-ordinator and Treasurer. Paul Redfearn, the club secretary asked to become the treasurer. This was explained in an email to members prior to the meeting with information about all the committee members who wished to stay in role. Once the committee had stood down,	
	those members who wanted to stay in	

their roles were voted back in by the members at the AGM.

10. Finance	The club are in a strong position financially. Emma Ribbon's ran through the financial year and provided a print of the accounts for members. She gave an overview of the headlines.	

	Easy fundraising has been a success and brought money into the club. Raffles have been a success: Thank you to Emma S for all your hard work in obtaining prizes. The 10k brings in lots of money for the club. New purchases have happened because of this, such as Flags, banners and a gazebo which are now used at events to publicise the club. Money has been invested into the community: 6 jackets for LS27 football team A crowd funder for the cricket club pavilion. A wreath for Armistice Day. A barrel of beer at the beer festival.	
11. 2025/2026 The future	This year looks like another great year from the club. Lots of things are planned: Christmas party Awards night Vets league Morley 10k Quiz night every month	

	Question: Could we put on more unofficial social events, Reply: The committee agreed this was a great idea and that people wanting to organise an event should do so either on the Facebook page or create a WhatsApp rather than the committee organising it and making it an official event.	
12. Morley 10k	Anthony Huggins spoke about the 10k. This looks set to be another great event. As of the night of the AGM, 1099 out of 1200 places have been sold. He thanked everyone who supports the event, runners, marshals, supporters and the 10k committee. 80 club members have signed up to run. This year has been more difficult to get volunteers but Kirsty has managed to pull everything together to cover the course with marshals. The race brings a lot of money into Morley and helps so many good causes. There will be a post on FB with a time for photographs of those members running.

13. Open floor for questions	Question: Could the reindeer run include runners from group 1 and 2 as it was felt that the previous runs have been at a faster pace than this? Reply: Anyone is welcome, it is an unofficial run so not one set up by MRC so members can join in and run at their own pace.
